# Building Project UPDATE





# EVERY FOUNDATION PROVIDING 3 Meals a Day

Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner are being served daily 7 days a week, 365 days a year now. Breakfast is at 8:00 am, Lunch at noon and Dinner at 4:30 pm. This has opened a door of opportunity for more volunteers and is supplying the homeless with 3 meals a day. These meals are open and free to all that are in need and we have seen a good response. ### DAY TIME SHELTER

Foundation Dinners is now providing also a place for the homeless to stay when the local shelters are closed. We open at 8:00 am and are closed at 5:30 pm every day so that homeless can have a refuge from the weather and have a safe place to stay through the day.
