New Kitchen Annex Open

Anyone who has served at the Foundation Dinners can tell you how crowded the kitchen *used* to be. Thanks to the efforts of Gary Clum and many businesses and individuals, this is no longer a problem.

The new kitchen annex opened in September with over 900 sq. feet, housing all the kitchen equipment with ample room for the volunteers and kitchen staff. Two more tables were added to the expanded dining area, seating 15-20 more guests. With the number of people served on the rise, this extra space was much needed.

The expanded facilities are requiring larger volunteer teams. The old kitchen felt overcrowded with three or four volunteers, but teams of six to eight volunteers are now needed for the evening



meal. Volunteers are asked to arrive 2:30-3:30 PM and should plan to stay until 6:00 PM.

We also need to fill some vacant spots in volunteer schedule. Please contact Gary Clum if you know of a group or individual who would consider volunteering. It is a wonderful opportunity to serve others in the name of Jesus, the greatest servant of all.

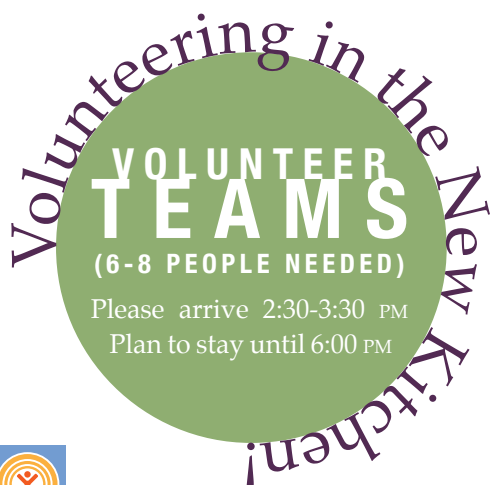
